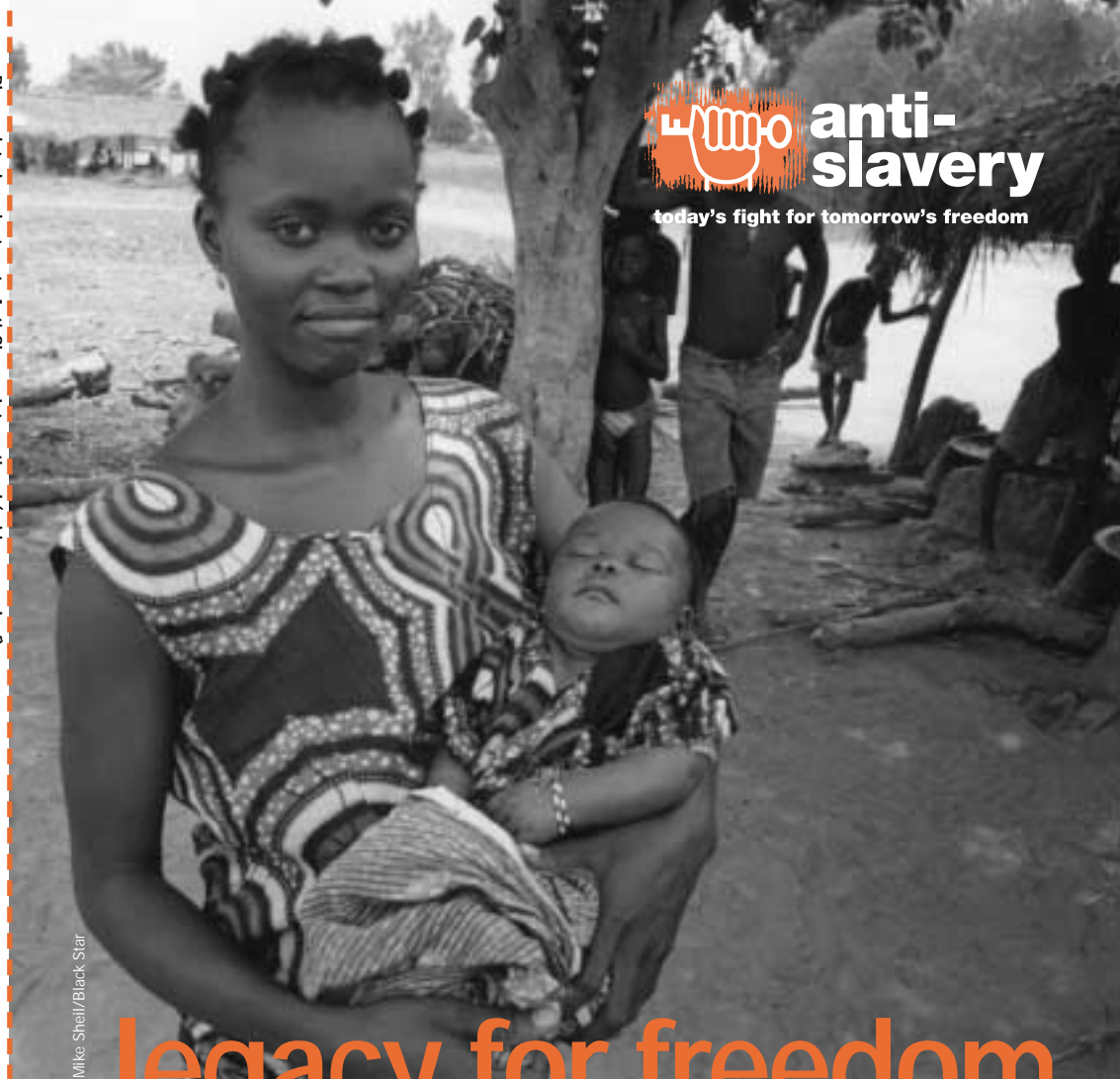

legacy for freedom

Most parents want the best for their children. They hope that they can provide them with what is needed for a happy and secure future.

Yet there are millions of mothers and fathers worldwide, trapped in slavery, facing the painful prospect that the legacy they are most likely to leave their children is that of a lifetime in slavery.

You can help create a world free from slavery

Anti-Slavery International, the world's oldest international human rights organisation, has been campaigning for the eradication of slavery for over 160 years. But slavery has not been consigned to history. Today, millions of people are trapped in slavery around the world.



Anti-Slavery International has worked with Jai Singh, (above) president of Dalit Dasta Virodhi Andolan (DDVA), for many years. DDVA is a human rights organisation that campaigns for the release of agricultural bonded labourers in India. He holds the testimony of labourers who were forced to work for local landlords to pay off loans. By informing local people of their rights and submitting individual cases to the police and courts, his work has helped free people from slavery.

Our work is based on the fundamental principle, that by equipping people with the knowledge and skills to fight slavery in their own countries, we will achieve sustainable change.

We aim to achieve our goal by exposing current cases of slavery and campaigning for their eradication, supporting the initiatives of local organisations to release people, and by pressing for more effective implementation of international laws against slavery.

Anti-Slavery International works to end child slavery and exploitative child labour, bonded labour, human trafficking and traditional or "chattel" slavery. We help the most vulnerable members of society. With an estimated **8.4 million** children currently in slavery worldwide, our work is vital.

Anti-Slavery International is the only organisation in the United Kingdom solely committed to eliminating all forms of slavery in today's world.

What your legacy can do

Thanks to a legacy of £20,000 from a longstanding supporter, we were able to continue work on a two year campaign against bonded labour, the most widespread form of slavery today.

People become bonded when their labour is demanded in return for a loan for such basic necessities as food and medicine. Adults, and all too often children, are typically forced to work long hours, for up to seven days a week, regardless of their age or health.

"The idea that the money should be used to protect young boys and in particular young girls would have been my father's first choice. Having spent three years in India during the war he returned in horror at the age at which children were working."

Family of legacy giver

Our campaign successfully raised awareness and understanding of this abuse among the general public and decision makers. Thanks to the legacy we were left, we were able to collect crucial evidence to expose the extent and causes of bonded labour, which is vital to persuade governments to develop and enforce laws against slavery. It also enabled us to support our local partners' work providing rehabilitation and retraining for freed bonded labourers.
